

# Notice of First Stage of Consultation

National Electricity Rules – Rule 8.9

## 1.1. November 2024 consolidation

Date of Notice: 11 October 2024

This Notice informs all Registered Participants, Metering Providers, Metering Data Providers, Embedded Network Managers, Ministers and the AER (**Persons**) that AEMO is conducting a process (**Consolidation Process**) in respect of the proposal (**Consolidation Proposal**) to consolidate, relevant versions of the Retail Electricity Market Procedures (**Consolidating Procedures**) which have a shared effective date of 4 November 2024.

This consultation is being conducted in accordance with the Rules consultation requirements detailed in Rule 8.9 of the National Electricity Rules.

### Matters under Consultation

AEMO is conducting the Consolidation Process to allow the Consolidating Procedures to enable accurate and up-to-date information.

The Consolidation Process does not involve any substantive changes to the Consolidating Procedures. The previous changes were consulted on in 2023 and 2024 in accordance with NER 8.9.
