3 Review and reshaping of RDC collaboration

Peter Carruthers (Slides 7-12)

- AEMO facilitated a discussion on how to ensure the RDC forum remains fit for purpose. Further details on this approach are outlined on slide 8 of the accompanying slide pack.
- AEMO outlined the proposed recommendations for the committee moving forward with a focus on cadence, agenda material, governance, membership and value proposition with detailed information are outlined on slide 11 of the accompanying slide pack.
- The proposals presented by AEMO on slide 11 were supported by the RDC:
 - List each recommendation
- In off-line discussions with RDC members prior to the session, one RDC member indicated better
 attendance could be achieved through enabling alternate representatives to attend, thus sharing the load.
 The RDC discussed this and agreed in principle this could be supported, on the conditions that any
 alternative representative is well informed and briefed before attending to enable continuity.
- In off-line discussions with interested RDC stakeholders prior to the session, AEMO received an
 expression of interest from a non-AEC retailer to join the RDC. The RDC discussed this and supported the
 additional diversity of membership this would bring, but noted that any new member has an obligation to
 represent the sector/industry and the best long-term interests of consumers rather than their own business
 specifically, and has a role in disseminating information to their representative group.
- The next steps will be to review the RDC Terms of Reference (ToR) and circulate to members for comment and endorsement. AEMO will adjust the cadence of the committee. Additional next steps are outlined on slide 12 of the accompanying slide pack.

Andrew Pirie – AEMC	Suggest the committee meet three times a year or when there is a need to discuss an informed Go Live process.	Noted.
Fergus Stuart – Origin Energy	In defining the role of the RDC we need to be clear in relation to its advisory vs approval roles and responsibilities.	Agreed. The RDC provides input and advice, and sometimes that advice may or may not align. AEMO will review and update the terms of reference to be explicit on where the decision occurs and who the decision makers are.
Geoff Hargreaves – Red Energy / Lumo Energy	The RDC has been a useful source for industry for changes to the roadmap and information dissemination.	Noted.

Dan Mascarenhas – Energy Australia	We need to work with the CEC and get more engagement from smaller participants in the market.	Noted. I think Dan took an action to facilitate this, can we note this pls.
Fergus Stuart – Origin Energy	Regarding independent retailers, would they be representing their own business?	AEMO's expectations are that independent participants of the RDC would be required to disseminate information with other participants through appropriate means (e.g., forums or email). AEMO will make this expectation clear through the Terms of Reference for the Committee.
Dan Mascarenhas – Energy Australia	Regarding non retailers who are involved in the DER space, what level of engagement and would AEMO consider extending the membership.	Diversification is welcomed. As DER related initiatives progress in the program, AEMO will look to engage with wider stakeholders groups accordingly. AEMO to finalise RDC value proposition to facilitate engaging additional members.
